A Note From Pastor Doug...

“Holy Humor Sunday”

Several years ago, I received a request from within our congregation to take a Sunday to think and reflect with the congregation around humor and laughter. I sat with this request for a while, thinking, praying, and looking at some different things. And I came across an old tradition, a tradition that takes the first Sunday after Easter and celebrates humor within the life of the church. So, that year, after Easter, we celebrated “Holy Humor Sunday” for the first time since I came.

This year, I've decided that we will once again take the opportunity to celebrate this “unofficial” church festival, on April 3. It seems quite appropriate to me that this year's celebration almost falls upon April Fool's Day!

In preparation for this service, I want to take some time to share a little background information about this celebration. Holy Humor Sunday is a revival of several old customs that see the time immediately after Easter as a time to engage in laughter and joy at the miracle of the Resurrection.

One of these old traditions originated in Bavaria in the 15th century, which included celebrating the Sunday after Easter as *Risus Paschalis*. This is a Latin phrase that means God's joke, or alternately the Easter joke. Priests in Bavaria would use the occasion to tell jokes from the pulpit, seeking to bring laughter into worship. As Christine Longhurst puts it: “It was their way of celebrating the resurrection of Christ – the supreme joke God played on Satan by raising Jesus from the dead.” The Orthodox church also has a tradition of laughter after Easter, which generally included gathering together on Easter Monday to tell jokes, funny stories, and to eat together.

Our service will revolve around laughter and joy, and I hope that this will be a meaningful service for our congregation. After all, we do enjoy having fun and laughing together!
