A Note From Pastor Doug...

“Dating Easter”

As I sat down this week to write about how we figure out when we will celebrate Easter, I realized that it was this week last year that we were celebrating this special holiday of the Christian calendar. Yet this year, as we enter into April, a number of weeks remain before Easter arrives. Unlike most other holidays that we celebrate these days, Easter moves around quite a bit from year to year. While there are some other holidays that don't necessarily end up on the same day each year like Christmas does, most of the other mobile holidays move around a few days to a week at most. Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day each move around from year to year, but you can be certain that they will come around a small number of dates from year to year. Memorial Day always falls in the last week of May, Labor Day around the first weekend in September, and Thanksgiving towards the end of November. Why is it, then, that Easter has such a wide range of dates?

Well, there are a number of factors that go into our calculations of the date of Easter, which in actuality can fall anywhere from March 22 to April 25. Last year we had a fairly early Easter, on March 27, and this year it falls on April 16. To understand why this occurs, we have to look at the way that Easter is calculated. The date of Easter, at least in the Western church, is calculated as the first Sunday following the first full moon after the Spring equinox. As the full moon varies in timing from year to year, Easter travels around the calendar to account for this factor.

Still, we may wonder why this is the calculation used. And to understand that, we need to remember that Easter is connected back to the Jewish celebration of Passover, which is where the connection to the full moon comes from. While the calculation of Easter and Passover have diverged over the centuries, this connection remains an important one as a basis for our own calculations.

Another historical quirk that affects the date of Easter, and ends up with Easter being celebrated on differing dates for those in the Orthodox tradition of Christianity, is the usage of a differing calendar system. Our calendar is based on the Gregorian calendar, whilst the Orthodox church continues to use the Julian calendar. These two calendars end up being a bit different, and because of this the Orthodox celebration of Easter generally occurs a week or two after our celebration of it. About once every four years, though, they are on the same date, as occurs this year. And back in 2010 and 2011, Easter fell on the same day for both western and Orthodox Christians for two years in a row, something that will not happen again for about 800 years.

Good Friday: An ecumenical Good Friday service will be held at St. Mark's Methodist Church in Daleville on April 14 at 7pm!

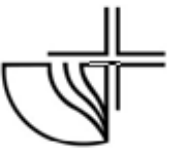
