“Power Up: Living in the Spirit”

Recently, I was able to go out and spend my usual week volunteering as a chaplain for a week at Camp Bethel. I always look forward to doing so, as it allows me to connect back to a part of my life that has influenced me in a very positive way. That is, both attending church camp as a child, and then working at two different camps as I was moving through college and seminary. Continuing to give support and leadership for the wonderful work of outdoor ministry that occurs each summer at Camp Bethel is a great joy for me each summer.

This year, I was able to join together with the camp staff to work with thirty junior high campers. This included opportunities for me to lead Bible studies on the theme, and to help plan and lead worship services each evening around the daily theme. I also had the opportunity to join in with the campers in many of the fun camp activities that make up a week of camp. I had the opportunity to join in with one of the units to go on the high ropes course, including going down the zip line, an activity that I have always loved since the first time I got to do it!

This year's theme was “Power Up: Living in the Spirit,” revolving around a study of different passages that explore the Holy Spirit. The theme was explored through a daily scripture passage, some of which included Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit in John 14, the story of Pentecost in Acts 2, and Paul's description of the Fruits of the Spirit in Galatians 5. Throughout the week, significant time was spent to think about the meaning of the Holy Spirit, and how the different actions and aspects of the Spirit affect campers daily lives.

Camp Bethel continues to offer wonderful and meaningful experiences for both campers and staff members to explore the meaning of living in Christian community. It is a wonderful resource that our district provides for those within our district, as well as others in the wider community to experience nature, to experience God's love, and to experience a true sense of community.

Daily Blister Packs Can Save Your Life

Can't remember if you took your medicines? Ask your pharmacist to make daily blister packs containing all your medicines. Not all pharmacies can make the packs--and the ones that do probably will charge extra for them, and that cost will not be reimbursed by insurance. But it may be a worthwhile expense if you want to be sure that you take all prescribed medicines every day and don't accidentally take any pill more than once.

(Editor's note: You also can buy a plastic pill organizer at most pharmacies that has compartments for daily pills.)
