“Seasons of the Church”

As we work on digging out from yet another snow storm this week, it is not uncommon for our thoughts to turn towards the changing of the season, from winter to spring. Especially after such a period of time this past month, that has seen such cold temperatures and large amounts of snow. I know that I, for one, have begun to look forward to warmer weather, and the possibilities of outdoor activities that don't involve shoveling or trudging through snow. We've come to expect the changes of the seasons in our weather patterns, year to year. We know where each part of the year falls within the four seasons, and what kind of weather we might expect from those seasons.

As I thought about the seasons, I began to think a little bit about the seasons that we move through each year in the church. I was especially reminded of this as we begin our journey into the season of Lent this year. This is one of a few seasons of the liturgical year that our congregation actively observes. The other major season, of course, is that of Advent. It is interesting, and perhaps worth thinking on, that the two seasons that we observe each year are ones that are dedicated to preparation. Advent being the preparation for Christmas, and Lent, of course, the time of preparation for Easter.

Much like the seasons of the year, each of the seasons of the church calendar bring with them certain markers that help us to recognize them. Each year, we take time to light Advent candles, dedicate a Sunday to our annual Christmas cantata, and hold a special service on Christmas Eve. Lent often sees us re-dedicating ourselves to different spiritual disciplines, the annual Awakening services held by our district, the celebration of special days and services including Palm Sunday, Love Feast, and the Easter Sunrise Service. These rituals and special services help us to remember different aspects of our faith tradition, and are a useful aid to us in our ongoing process of spiritual growth.



Awakening Services

The Awakening Services for 2015 will be held on March 22-25 at the Troutville Church of the Brethren located at 5133 Lee Highway in Troutville, VA. The theme for 2015 is (Can We) See a New World Coming!

David Radcliff is this year's Awakening speaker. David grew up in the Blue Ridge congregation, and graduated from Bethany Seminary (MDiv and DMin in Peace Studies). He was a pastor for 10 years, including being on the staff at Williamson Road, before being hired to serve as director of Brethren Witness for the denomination. In 2003, David and others launched the New Community Project, a small Christian nonprofit organization with a big goal: to change the world. NCP has a national network and partners in six countries, where it supports girls' education, women's empowerment and reforestation. David is a regular speaker in schools, colleges and congregations around the country, leads Learning Tours to the Amazon, Arctic, Asia, Africa and Latin America, and was the 2008 recipient of Bridgewater College's West/Whitelow Humanitarian Award. He currently lives in Peoria, AZ, but still calls Virginia home.

Services begin with a hymn sing at 6:45 p.m. followed by worship at 7:00 p.m. Morning Bible Study will be held with a light breakfast from 9 -11 a.m. at the following locations:
