A Note From Pastor Doug...

Perfecting God's Love

In February, I had the opportunity to speak at a Lenten lunch service at the Fincastle United Methodist Church. As I began my preparations for that day, I had to decide upon a scripture passage to use in the service. So I looked at several different possibilities, and finally settled upon 1 John 2:1-6. And I decided upon this passage because I thought it presented a very interesting idea to reflect up, an idea that comes from verse 5, which reads "the love of God is truly perfected in whoever keeps his word." In other words, God's love is perfected as we obey God's commandments.

How, though, might we do this? How are we to be obedient to the way of life that God desires for us? There is a hint, I think, in the final verse, which tells us "The one who claims to remain in him ought to live in the same way as he lived." Or in other words, our way of life as Christians should be to emulate Jesus, to seek to live out our lives in a similar manner to that of Jesus.

Now, this idea isn't really a new one for us as Brethren. Our denomination exists because our founders sought to follow the directives and examples given by Jesus. We have had a tendency in our denomination to emphasize the life and work of Jesus to be as important as his death and resurrection, for it is in Jesus' life and ministry that we find how we should live as Christians.

Thinking about all of this, I was reminded of Jesus' words in Matthew 22:37-40: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." As we seek to find a way to perfect God's love in our lives, we would do well to find ways to live out these two commandments.

As we continue to journey towards Easter, let us be sure to take time to find ways to live out the commandments of Jesus to love God with all of our heart, mind, and soul, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. In doing so, we begin to perfect God's love in our own lives, as we are obedient to God's instructions to us through Jesus.
