Camp Bethel's Heritage Day

Every summer, Camp Bethel's summer camp program offers opportunities for many children to spend time in the great outdoors, to learn and grow in Christian faith, and to have lots of fun and adventures. It's been a wonderful pleasure for me to be able to continue to support this important ministry of our district through serving as a camp chaplain for a week each year since we have come to Daleville.

While this is an important ministry for our district, it is one that comes with a significant financial cost. Some of that cost is covered by the summer camping fees, of course, but that revenue stream alone is not sufficient to cover all the myriad expenses of running the camp. One of the ways that the costs are covered are through various fundraisers through the year, and on Saturday, October 1 one of the more important fundraisers takes place, the Heritage Day festival.

Barry LeNoir, the camp director, explains a little about Heritage Day as he writes "You and your congregation are invited to once again participate in Camp Bethel and the Virlina District's 32nd Annual Brethren Heritage Celebration, also known as Heritage Day. With many additions and changes to the event since 1984, Heritage Day still remains the "grandest of Camp Bethel's days." In 2015, your combined efforts and events raised \$34,050! 100% of Heritage Day revenue directly funds our ministry; **thus Heritage Day is camp's most important fund-raising event, providing 6% of camp's total annual funding!**"

Our congregation has, in the past, sponsored a booth at Heritage Day. However, since we no longer do so, we support this important fundraiser in two ways. One, we are encouraging everyone to attend Heritage Day. Our other method is by taking up a special offering for Heritage Day. Our last official day for that will be Sunday, October 2, but if you decide later on to give, we'll gladly send the money on to Camp Bethel.

Daleville Church of the Brethren will offer a training in Dementia and Spirituality on Sunday, October 9, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. This class will address types of dementia, the prevalence of some of the most common types, how these disorders impact the individual, and tips for assisting persons with dementia and their families. The goal of the class is to help persons understand what dementia is and to have tips for how to help our congregation members.

Who should attend: Pastors, Deacons, Sunday School teachers, anyone who would like to have more insight into the disease process and how to assist our members with dementia to continue be active participants in our congregations.

The speaker is Heddie Sumner, BSN, RN. Heddie has 20+ years of working in the aging field, with Certificates in Advanced Dementia Care from the Turner Geriatric Center at University of Michigan.
